Scripture

- 31 “When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on his glorious throne.
- 32 All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate them one from another, just as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats.
- 33 He will put the sheep on his right and the goats on the left.
- 34 Then the King will say to those on his right, ‘Come, you who are blessed by my Father; inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world.
- 35 “For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat; I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink; I was a stranger and you took me in;
- 36 I was naked and you clothed me; I was sick and you took care of me; I was in prison and you visited me.’
- 37 “Then the righteous will answer him, ‘Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink?
- 38 When did we see you a stranger and take you in, or without clothes and clothe you?
- 39 When did we see you sick, or in prison, and visit you?’
- 40 “And the King will answer them, ‘Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.’
- 41 “Then he will also say to those on the left, ‘Depart from me, you who are cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels!
- 42 For I was hungry and you gave me nothing to eat; I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink;
- 43 I was a stranger and you didn’t take me in; I was naked and you didn’t clothe me, sick and in prison and you didn’t take care of me.’
- 44 “Then they too will answer, ‘Lord, when did we see you hungry, or thirsty, or a stranger, or without clothes, or sick, or in prison, and not help you?’
- 45 “Then he will answer them, ‘Truly I tell you, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me.’
- 46 “And they will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life.”

God's Word - Devoted to Him

*Remember the poor.
Galatians 2:10*

Why does God allow so many of His children to be poor? If He wanted to, He could make them all rich—He could lay bags of gold at their doors, send them a large annual income, or scatter an abundance of provisions around their homes, just as He once made quail lie in heaps around the camp of Israel and rained bread from heaven to feed the people. There is no reason that God's people should be poor, except that He deems it best.

God owns “the cattle on a thousand hills” (Psalm 50:10)—He could supply them to His people. He could make the richest, the greatest, and the mightiest bring all their power and wealth to the feet of His children, for the hearts of all people are in His control. But God does not choose to do so—He allows His children to suffer need, to languish in poverty and obscurity. Why is this?

There are many reasons. One reason is to give those of us who have enough an opportunity of showing love to Jesus. We express love to Christ when we sing of Him and when we pray to Him, but if there were no needy children in the world we would lose the sweet privilege of demonstrating our love by charity to His poor brothers. He has ordained that we should prove our love goes beyond just words—that it exists in deeds and in truth.

If we truly love Christ, we will care for those He loves. Those who are dear to Him will be dear to us. So let us look on generosity not as a duty, but as a privilege to relieve the poor of the Lord's flock. May we always remember the words of our Lord Jesus: “As you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me” (Matthew 25:40).

Surely this promise is sweet enough, this motive strong enough, to lead us to help others with a willing hand and a loving heart. Know that all you do for God's people is graciously accepted by Christ as done to himself.

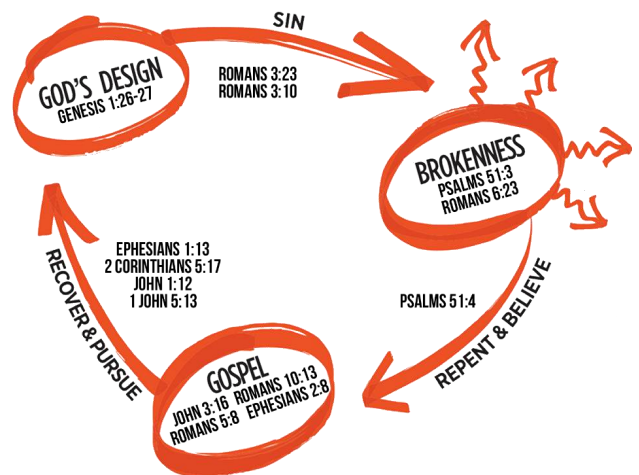

Our name is on God's account. We have unrestricted access to it, a privilege that is subject to abuse. As His money managers, God trusts us to set our own salaries. We draw needed funds from His wealth to pay our living expenses. One of our central spiritual decisions is determining what is a reasonable amount to live on. Whatever that amount is—and it will legitimately vary from person to person—we shouldn't hoard or spend the excess. After all, it's His, not ours. And He has something to say about where to put it.

Every spring my wife and I read through dozens of letters of people in our church who are going on summer mission trips. This year we received forty-five requests asking us to pray and contribute financially. When this time comes each year; I'm like a kid in a candy store—a candy store as big as the world, as big as the heart of God.

Why such excitement?

Because we get to hear the stories and read the emails. We see the enthusiasm, the growth, the kingdom-mindedness, the changed priorities. We gain vested interest in more facets of God's work around the world. We pray that those who go—as well as those to whom they go—will never be the same. And we will have a part in it!

Recently I was attending a gathering of givers. We went around the room and told our stories. The words *fun, joy, exciting, and wonderful* kept surfacing. There were lots of smiles and laughter, along with tears of joy. One older couple eagerly shared how they are always traveling around the world, getting involved in the ministries they're giving to. Meanwhile, their home in the states is becoming rundown. They said, "Our children keep telling us, 'Fix up your house or buy a new one. You can afford it.' We tell them, 'Why would we do that? That's not what excites us!'"

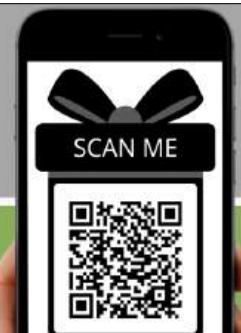
